I am requesting funding for the Tonopah Child Development Center Project in fiscal year 2023.

The entity to receive funding for this project is Nye County at 2100 E. Walt Williams Dr., Ste. 100, Pahrump, NV 89048.

Funding is requested to design and build a new Child Development Center, fulfilling an unmet critical community need. Tonopah, NV has no licensed childcare providers. Licensure by the State of Nevada ensures that providers meet minimum standards that protect children and provide opportunities to thrive, grow and develop. It also presents opportunities for low-income families to participate in childcare subsidies, which can only be utilized at participating licensed programs. Both the County and the Town of Tonopah have identified childcare as a critical need. The County is seeking federal assistance to help with designing and constructing a child development center to serve child and families in and around Tonopah, NV. The proposed Child Development Center is part of the Town's efforts to prevent social problems, help the community get to work, support local business' needs, and increase recruitment and retention efforts of critical service professionals in the area.
